Club Financial Report

If your club has no bank account, write a short letter (Example)

All bank statements from July '22-June '23

**Annual Review of club funds** 

**Club Assets** (Not all clubs will have assets)

Budget for the coming year

**Annual Plan** 

**Affirmative Action Form**



Start your note with a greeting. (EX: Dear Elder Trucking,)
Get your list of buyers and add-on providers from the Extension Office so you have their name and mailing address.

#### What/Why?

WHAT do you want to say? Thank you! Start with these importnat words and then explain WHY you are thankful. (EX: Thank you so much for your generous add-on and continued support of my 4-H projects.)

#### **Details**

Give them some details about the difference their donation or purchase will make in your life. What will this money help you accomplish? What are your future plans? Do you hope to see them again next year?

#### Restate

Before ending your letter, be sure to restate your thanks! (EX: Thank you again and I hope to see you again at the next county fair!

#### Regards

End your letter by giving your regards and signing your full name. (EX: Sincerely, Bob Bobington - With great appraiciation, Sally Sanderson)
