Welcome to Garfield County 4-H Shooting Sports

Are you interested in firearms and learning to handle them correctly and safely? Then the Garfield County Shooting Sports Program is for you!

4-H Shooting Sports is unique because it is oriented to the individual. Shooting is an activity that can be practiced throughout life, and the entire family can participate. Garfield County's 4-H Shooting Sports program provides opportunity for kids, ages 8 to 18, to learn marksmanship, the principles of hunting and archery, and the safe and responsible use of firearms. We promote the highest standards of sportsmanship, safety and ethical behavior.

Our program also encourages an appreciation of natural resources as well as teaches decision-making, self discipline, and problem-solving, while helping kids to build character and leadership skills.

The best part of the Garfield County Shooting Sports program? 4-H is a great place to meet and make new friends that last a lifetime, while sharing fun learning activities!

You can learn any or all of these disciplines:

- .22 Rifle
- .22 Pistol** (12 years w/Air Pistol)
- Air Rifle
- Air Pistol
- Shotgun
- Archery
- Muzzleloading
- Outdoor Skills

- Western Heritage*
- * Members need to be 12 years of age with a minimum of 1 year of .22 rifle or shotgun.
- **Members need to be 12 years of age and either have completed 1 year of air pistol or attend a minimum of 3 air pistol practices to pass the safety certification by instructor.

Shooting is a skill that requires self-discipline, concentration, and individual effort. It can also require considerable financial resources. It is important that you keep a good record of what you have learned, and how you learned. You will also keep a record of practices, leadership roles, expenses, property and equipment, expenditures, and other aspects of your shooting experience. Your shooting experience will mean more to you when you look at your records and see how you have progressed from a beginner to a skilled shooter!

Studying and learning about shooting is fun. The Colorado 4-H Shooting Sports curriculum is designed to help youth learn how to care for, and the safe use of, shooting sports equipment. Members will learn the safe use of firearms through

practices, talks, demonstrations, and exhibits. The key to any 4-H project is for youth to enjoy themselves and to evolve at their own pace.

Shooting Sports offers many educational experiences, from learning the shooting basics, critical safety practices, to poise and concentration. Parents can be a big help if they are involved with their child's learning, especially for younger 4-H members. Youth are more excited to learn if they have parental support and interest in what they are doing. Therefore, parents are encouraged to sit in on meetings and ask their child about what they learned. As they mature, youth should take on more responsibility for their learning and move to independent learning. Parental evolvement will reinforce what youth learn at any age.

In addition to learning about the safe use of firearms, youth enrolled in 4-H shooting sports are also eligible to participate in numerous leadership development and educational activities including: County and State Fair competition, out of county trips, state and national trips, club officer training, scholarships, citizenship, community service and recreational activities.

You can enroll by contacting the Garfield County CSU Extension Office at 970-625-3969. Our friendly and helpful 4-H staff will provide you with the names of 4-H clubs and leaders in your area. You'll attend a club meeting and find the club that fits you best.

Parents of shooting sports members should attend practices. This helps ensure the safety of the child or children during practice. It also helps keep parents involved in what their child in learning and doing, which is critical for your child's development, self-esteem and educational experience.

How to participate in Shooting Sports Events

<u>To participate in the Garfield County Shoot</u>: Members who meet these requirements will be eligible to participate in the Garfield County Shoot.

- 1. Be in good standing with their club and with 4-H.
- 2. Fulfill their club meeting requirements.
- 3. Give a club demonstration.
- 4. Participate in their club Community Service activity.
- 5. Have a valid Hunter Safety card.
- 6. Record Book must be 70% complete, signed by a certified Shooting Sports leader in at least one discipline in which the member is enrolled.
- 7. Record Book and display board or stand- alone project must be turned in at General Projects judging.
- 8. Attend a 4-H safety class before member is allowed to shoot.
- 9. Participating in club practices with certified leaders of that discipline in order to count.
 - a. 5 practices for one disciple are required.
 - b. 3 practices per discipline for multiple disciplines are required
 - i. 3 practices per discipline to qualify for all disciplines enrolled in or you must have 5 practices for one discipline.
 - c. <u>Practices must be at a sanctioned practice by GARCO Shooting Sports Council and have certified leaders.</u>
 - d. 4-H Members must sign in and out at each range for practice to count.
 - e. <u>An official practice must have at least 2 certified leaders at a certified range</u> and be approved by the CSU Extension office.
- 10. For a practice to count in Archery, a member must sign in and demonstrate the use of 24 arrows.
- 11. To participate in the County Shoot for Shotgun members must have completed the following practices per class
 - a. 2 practices for Trap (1 practice is equal to 50 clays)
 - b. 2 practices for Skeet (1 practice is equal to 50 clays)
 - c. 1 practice for Sporting Clays (1 practice is equal to 100 clays)
- 12. Submit enrollment in Fair Entry, Garfield County Fair.
- 13. Upload Hunter Safety Card in 4-H Online by July 1st.
- 14. Members new to 4-H Shooting Sports program should only participate in 1 discipline with a maximum of 2 disciplines the first year.

- 15. <u>Top Shot Awards</u> are determined by points received from the points possible in the following areas:
 - a. Archery Must shoot in 2 contest areas
 - i. Compound Limited, Unlimited or Traditional
 - ii. Recurve Traditional, Limited
 - b. Shotgun Must shoot in all 3 contest areas
 - i. Trap
 - ii. Skeet
 - iii. Sporting Clays
 - c. Rifle Must shoot in 2 contest areas
 - i. Hunt
 - ii. Scope
 - iii. 3-P
 - iv. 4-P
 - d. Air Rifle Must shoot in 2 contest areas
 - i. 25' Utility
 - ii. 4-P
 - iii. 3-P
 - iv. Olympic Off-Hand

<u>Regional and Non-County Shoots</u>: There are three events held yearly in the Tri River Area, one in each county (Delta, Mesa and Montrose). There may be other county sponsored events throughout the state. This does not include the Garfield County Invitational, Garfield County Shoot or Colorado State Fair Shoot. To participate as a 4-H member in these events, youth must:

- 1. Be in good standing with their club and with 4-H.
- 2. Members need not have a Hunter Safety card however they and their parents will be required to sign a wavier prior to the event.
- 3. Attend a shooting sports safety training.
- 4. Participate in a minimum of three practices in each discipline to count.
- 5. Member's registration form for a competitive event must include a signature from a certified leader from at least one of the disciplines entered.



<u>To participate in the Colorado State Shooting Sports Championship:</u> Members who meet these requirements will be eligible to be entered for the Colorado State Fair Shoot.

- 1. Be in good standing with their club and with 4-H.
- 2. Fulfill their club meeting requirements.
- 3. Give a club demonstration.
- 4. Participate in their club Community Service activity.
- 5. Uploaded a valid Hunter Safety card in 4-H Online by July 1st.
- 6. Record Book must be signed by a certified Shooting Sports leader in at least one discipline in which the member is enrolled.
- 7. Record Book and display board or standalone project must be entered, and interview done either the day of General Projects judging or by special arrangement prior to judging day.
- 8. Attend a safety class before member is allowed to shoot.
- 9. Must qualify at County Shoot to be eligible for State Shoot.

Where will I shoot?

The Garfield County 4-H Shooting Sports program operates at several different ranges. However, the Garfield County Invitational and Garfield County Shoot are held at The Rifle Sportsman's Club shooting range.



From Interstate 70, Exit 90

Follow Interstate 70 to the #90 exit. Go north on Hwy 13. At the intersection of Hwy 13 and the Hwy 13 Bypass, turn west (left). At the top of the hill, turn west (left) again at the Forest Service signs. Continue on past the Forest Service building until you see the range signs.

From Interstate 70, Exit 87

Follow Interstate 70 to the #87 exit. Go east on Hwy 6 & 24. At the intersection of Hwy 6 & 24 and the Hwy 13 Bypass, turn north (left). At the top of the hill, turn west (left) again at the Forest Service signs. Continue on past the Forest Service building until you see the range signs.

Eyes and Ears

Youth involved in shooting activities need to understand the importance of protecting their eyes and ears. Approved eye and ear protection is required when participating in any 4-H Shooting Sports practice or competition.

Range Safety

Members, parents and leaders should be aware that safe use of the range is critical for everyone to have a fun learning experience. Here are a few safety rules to follow (check with your range officer for more instruction):

- Dogs and other pets are not allowed on the range.
- No climbing or playing on the berms or hills.
- All spectators are to remain in designed areas.
- All plants and wildlife are to be left undisturbed.
- Participants and spectators are encouraged to bring their own shade, water and sunscreen as needed.
- Upon arrival at the range, shooters are to leave their firearms in their vehicle. Shooters will bring their firearms to the firing line only when instructed by their range instructor.
- Shooters are responsible to bring their own firearms, ammo, ear and eye protection and appropriate equipment and supplies.
- Firearms utilized by all shooters are subject to the approval of certified discipline leaders for the compliance with state 4-H Shooting Sports requirements and safety factors.

Hunter Safety Card

Hunter Safety Education is an important part of 4-H Shooting Sports. Shooting Sports members must have a Hunter Safety card to participant in County and State Shoot Competition. Other area shooting events require either a Hunter Safety card or a special waiver if the member is enrolled to participate in a Hunter Safety Class.

You don't have to shoot to participate!

4-H Shooting Sports Display Requirements:

So, what do you do if you just want to learn more about firearms and ammunition? How do you do that and still participate in the County and State Fair? Well, Garfield County 4-H offers an option to create a Shooting Sports display that you can take to these events. In Garfield County, you may compete in the County and State Fair by completing a display board and qualifying for the State Fair.

However, in Garfield County, to compete in the State Fair Shoot, it is required to complete a display board or a stand- alone project along with qualifying at the County Shoot.

Project Exhibit Rules:

All Standalone Exhibits will consist of the following:

- 1. Completed E-record with all pages being complete and in order. N/A should be written on disciplines not applicable for youth.
- 2. Record Book should be exhibited in a binder with prongs or rings.
- 3. No live ammo tipped arrows (including field points, broadheads), knives, functional or nonfunctional firearms or bows will be allowed as an exhibit. Cardboard, paper cutouts or décor resembling firearms or bows are allowed for display purposes in stand-alone classes.
- 4. Stand-alone items are items that are made to enhance discipline, such as a quiver, gun case, gun stand, etc. No display boards or decorative items are allowed in the Stand-Alone Classes.
- 5. Because of limited floor space, those items that will be displayed on the floor will be a maximum size of 3 feet in width and depth and 7ft in height. The item must be stable when standing to be displayed. If an exhibit is larger than this, a notebook can be used as an exhibit showing how and what was made.
- 6. No stand-alone items that are an exhibit at the time of the contests will be allowed to be removed from the building to be used at the contests.
- 7. A new class has been added. This is a decorative item class. Items to be exhibited in this class are items that are used to decorate a room, building, etc. Be sure to look at the classes to determine where your exhibit item fits.
- 8. Decorative items are items that are made from materials from different disciplines but are for aesthetic value in decorating a room or as jewelry. All items from all the disciplines that are decorative will be in these classes.


Display Board:

- 1. Completed E-record with all pages being complete and in order. N/A should be written on disciplines not applicable for youth.
- 2. Record Book should be exhibited in a binder with prongs or rings.
- 3. Display should illustrate a chosen aspect of skill areas. This is separate from the Colorado State 4-H Shooting Sports Championships. (The standardized display board size of 4 ft. x 3 ft. is to be used with 4-H projects. No additional items may be included on or in front of the display board.) No wooden display cases.
- 4. No live ammo tipped arrows (including field points, broadheads), knives, functional or nonfunctional firearms or bows will be allowed as an exhibit. Cardboard, paper cutouts or décor resembling firearms or bows are allowed for display purposes in the display.
- 5. Do not use the word weapon when creating your display. Make sure that there are no safety violations in your display. (Example: no earplugs, no safety glasses on a photo of a youth firing his/her gun.) Do not use pictures primarily tactical in design firearms in you display, i.e., AR platform or military type firearms.
- 6. The display board topics should stay in close relationship with your discipline. Please do not use topics outside the scope of your 4-H project. (Example: .22 Rifle Project should not use the topic of different types of military machine guns.)
- 7. No additional items may be included on or in front of display board.
- 8. See attached example display board.

Display Board Guidelines for State Fair 4-H Exhibits

Display boards are a great way to share information, but when viewers walk by, they spend only 60-90 seconds looking at each display board. Make yours stand out by highlighting the main points of your project in a fun, interesting way.

Follow these guidelines to create a display board for the state fair.



What Else Can I Do?

There are lots of fun things to do in the Garfield County 4-H Shooting Sports program! Please check your monthly 4-H newsletter for dates and instructions on how to register for these events. Here are a few of them:

- Delta Invitational Shoot- Held at the Delta County 4-H Range in Eckert. Youth from the Western Slope of Colorado are invited to this competition. Hunter Safety cards are not required to participate in this event. Members without a Hunter Safety card need to fill out a waiver prior to the event. Entry forms are due to the Delta County Extension Office.
- Mesa Invitational Shoot-Held in Mesa County. Youth from the Western Slope of Colorado are invited to this competition. Hunter Safety cards are not required to participate in this event, waivers are required if a Hunter Safety card is not available. Entry forms are due to the Mesa County Extension Office.
- Montrose Invitational Shoot-Held in Montrose County. Youth from the Western Slope of Colorado are invited to this competition. Hunter Safety cards are not required to participate in this event, waivers are required if a Hunter Safety card is not available. Entry forms are due to the Montrose County Extension Office.
- Garfield County Jim Bailey, Bruce Collins & Ali Johnson Memorial Invitational -Held in Rifle at The Rifle Sportsman's Club. Youth from the Western Slope of Colorado are invited to this competition. Hunter Safety cards are not required to participate in this event, waivers are required if a Hunter Safety card is not available. Entry forms are due to the Garfield County Extension Office.
- Garfield County Shoot-Held in Rifle at The Rifle Sportsman's Club. Youth from Garfield County compete to qualify for competition at the Colorado State Fair. Hunter Safety cards are required to participate in this event. County Contest entries are due before July 1st. County contest will take place either the second or third weekend of July.
- Colorado State Fair Shooting Events-Held in Pueblo, Colorado. Youth from throughout the state of Colorado participate in this competition. Hunter Safety cards are required to participate in this event. Youth must have competed in County Shoot to qualify for the State Shoot. Colorado State Fair will not accept entries from individuals.

Complementary Projects

Outdoor Adventure

Do you like to camp? Then this is the project for you! This project progresses from day to overnight camping trips, to finally planning an extended backpack expedition. Great fun for adventures!

Wildlife

Colorado's wildlife is one of our state's biggest attractions. This project will teach about wildlife behavior, habitat requirements, how wildlife species fit into nature's scheme, how they manage, and how they relate to humans.

Therefore, Colorado 4-H Rimfire Pistol, Centerfire Pistol or Western Heritage Project Leaders will require "the prior written consent of the juvenile's parent or guardian who is not prohibited by Federal, State, or local law from possessing a firearm." This written permission must be in possession of the youth or on file with a Colorado 4-H Rimfire Pistol, Centerfire Pistol or Western Heritage Project Leader – even if a parent/guardian is present. Please fill out the form below with the name of the youth, a parent's name, address, as well as their signature, and that of a witness and dates. If participating with another club or 4-H Rimfire Pistol, Centerfire Pistol or Western Heritage event, the 4-H member can provide a copy of this form to any 4-H Pistol or Western Heritage Project Leader. Failure to have this document will require officials to disqualify the shooter to avoid violation of federal law.

- 4. I understand that I will be required to Exhibit My Project via a stand-alone or display board to demonstrate my learning at the 4-H General Project Judging event during the current year. Specifics about projects displays are available are located on pages 9 and 10 of the Garfield County Shooting Sports Member Reference Book.
- 5. I understand that if I do not turn in my project and record book with an interview on or before Exhibit Day judging, I will not eligible to participate at the State Shoot.
- 6. If I receive a white ribbon on my project and record book, I will not eligible to participate at the State Shoot until I have revised my book and project to at least a Red Ribbon Quality within the given time allotted by the 4-H Agent.
- 7. I understand that practices are generally held on a weekly basis throughout the warm weather months and that I must communicate with my discipline Leader(s) in the event of bad weather, etc.
- 8. I understand that my Project Record Book (E-Record) may be found on https://co4h.colostate.edu/program-areas/natural-resource/ and that is my responsibility to obtain and begin to work on my Record Books in a timely fashion.
